2025 Legislative Session Summary



May 2025

The following brief summarizes legislative and 2025-27 operating budget outcomes from the 2025 legislative session related to the Washington Student Achievement Council (WSAC) and the state's broader postsecondary education landscape.

Agency Legislation Requests

WSAC requested three bills in advance of the 2025 legislative session. Two of these were introduced by legislators. One was funded in former Gov. Inslee's proposed 2025-27 operating budget and subsequently passed by the Legislature:

- <u>HB 1540</u>—Expanding eligibility for the Supporting Students Experiencing Homelessness program to an accredited tribal college (Northwest Indian College).
- <u>SB 5275</u>*—Making Passport to Careers (PTC) an entitlement program, codifying annual PTC awards of \$5,000, and automatically qualifying PTC-eligible students for maximum WA Grant awards.

The table below summarizes new appropriations and cuts to postsecondary education in the 2025-27 operating budget, which was passed by the Legislature. The items are ordered by their relation to WSAC's policy clusters.
